Travels in China: Last Fall, IWCNE member **Johanna Mangion** and her husband Bob, along with another couple, spent three months traveling throughout China. This adventuresome foursome were completely on their own in this expansive country. Making their way via area bus, train, plane, car and foot and staying in hostels presented many challenges to them, including coping with the language. At the same time, this unescorted mode of travel enabled them to see a great variety of aspects of China and to interact with Chinese people encountered in a way that would not have been possible on a guided

tour. With a Chinese dictionary and a great deal of help from the many highly welcoming and supportive Chinese they met on their travels, they completed a trip that took them, both on and off the tourist path, across thousands of miles of China and vertically from the height of the Mount Everest base camp at 17,000 feet down to sea level at the beaches of southern China. At our luncheon, Johanna and Bob will share their experiences along with photographs of people, landscapes, art and architecture of this vast and rapidly changing country.
