At our final major fundraiser of the year, we host vendors who sell a variety of goods and we serve homemade soup for lunch and sell our own homemade goods at our bake sale table.

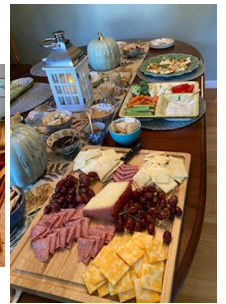
Please join us for a wonderful day!!! And invite family, friends & neighbors. The Funds we raise will support this year's charities.

Holiday Fair Bake Table

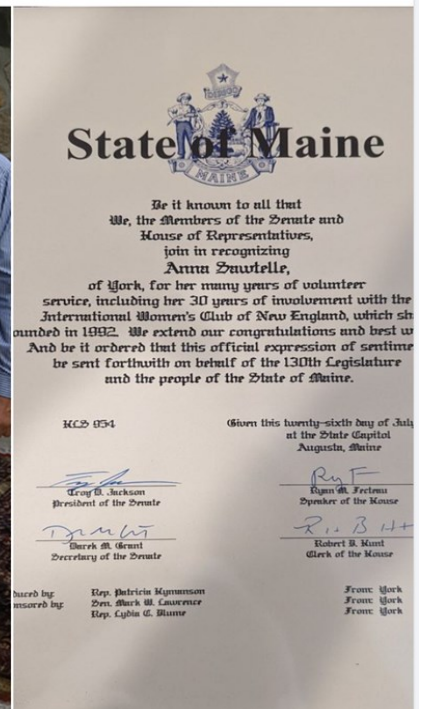
