Robert Stevens, Principal, York High School, will talk about one of the most memorable figures of the last century, and someone whose writings and biographies he has studied for many years.

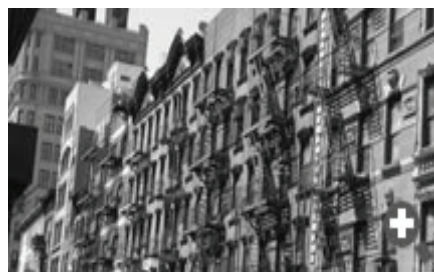
July Program– The Immigrant Experience

Speaker: Stuart Dawson “The Importance of Preserving Classic Contemporary Landscapes.”

Should designed landscapes be designated landmarks to protect them from development pressures? Change is inevitable but isn't continuity just as important? We'll hear about this current design debate from local Maine resident, Stuart Dawson.

Stuart Dawson is a world renowned landscape architect/urban designer and a founding Principal of Sasaki Associates. He continues to have an active professional life though technically retired and a full time resident of York ME. Stu consults with many communities and organizations along the Seacoast and his sense of design improves our lives on a daily basis. Among many accolades, he is considered to be a “pioneer” of our designed landscape heritage by the Cultural Landscape Foundation and has major award-winning urban and waterfront developments to his credit. John Forti, curator of historical landscapes at Strawberry Banke, will join us in the wonderful Victorian landscape recreated from the original 1862 garden plan. The Victorian Society of America presented Strawberry Banke Museum with The Preservation Award for the restoration work done in the Goodwin garden and hot-house.
