This month member Joyce Marchand reported on Switzerland, where she lived until recently. This European country is unique in many ways, including being politically neutral since 1515! It has only been a member of the United Nations since 2002 and is not part of the European Union, although it does allow free EU member movement across the borders. This system of government is unusual in that all legislation is done by referendum. In regards to the refugee situation, Joyce described how the Swiss people are struggling with the dichotomy of a tradition of humanitarianism vs. the preservation of Swiss culture.

Today's Program

Today's Luncheon Speaker: IWCNE Member, Lynn Pahland Retired Director, Health Promotion and Wellness Policy Reporting to Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense for Health Affairs

"Focus on General Health Promotion Opportunities with Select Foreign Militaries"

Specifics on targeted HIV prevention activities (with subsequent additional attention on malaria and other blood borne illnesses), US Military and select foreign militaries and international peace keeping forces. The program was initiated in the Clinton administration and has grown from selected sub-Saharan African countries to selected worldwide countries. Activities were coordinated under guidance of the DOD, the State Department, involved country militaries and Ministries of Health, and many other NGOs and education entities.

August Luncheon Speaker A Memoir of World War II and Postwar Britain Ice Cream, Gasmasks, and God

A presentation by **Joyce Lovely** reviewing her life during World War II in Liverpool, England and the postwar years. Questions, of course, will be welcomed.

Over seventy years has passed since the ending of World War II. In her book, Joyce Lovely recounts growing up in Liverpool, England amid air raids, bombs and gasmasks. As a child, she tells of life during the war from her perspective, allowing the grown-ups to worry about battles, rations and lack of necessities.

Postwar Britain continued to be difficult with rationing extending until 1953, the year Queen Elizabeth was crowned. She brings the reader into the life of a teenager in the fifties, where girls had strict mores to follow, but still had fun that included her two working years in London. The book concludes with her marriage to a minister and their first three years of living in the far flung Shetland Islands. Here, she shares how she rebelled against the island expectations of 'yon minister's wife' as well as the usual accounts of village life, often with hilarious results. Joyce will present her book, sharing some of the highlights, as well as a few other stories of war time England, not perhaps included in her book.
