President's Message

Three cheers for another successful potluck - this time hosted by Nancy Geyerhahn! We had a lovely evening AND raised \$150 for charity. And, by popular demand, another recipe: Mexican Chocolate Cake (very easy):

1-1/2 cups all-purpose flour

1 cup sugar

1/2 cup unsweetened cocoa

1 teaspoon cinnamon

1 teaspoon baking soda

1/8 teaspoon cayenne pepper

1 cup cold water

1/4 cup canola oil

1 tablespoon balsamic vinegar

1 tablespoon vanilla extract

Chocolate Glaze

1 cup confectioners' sugar 1/2 cup cocoa

6 tablespoons water



Heat oven to 350 F. Lightly coat an 8-inch round cake pan with vegetable cooking spray. Combine all the cake ingredients in a mixing bowl and stir until smooth. Pour into the pan and bake for 25-30 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Cool in the pan on a wire rack for 10 minutes. Remove from pan and cool completely. When the cake has cooled, whisk together the glaze ingredients. Pour the glaze over the cake. Set aside to dry, about 30 minutes.
