Catherine Ann Wilson, Founder of "Stop Trafficking US" and Jonathan Sahrbeck, Cumberland County District Attorney

Abused repeatedly from first grade on for nearly 20 years of her life, Catherine Ann Wilson spent most of her years from age 12 – 17 living on the street. By age 15, starving and desperate, she was lured into sex trafficking – taken in and then held against her will by a local pimp. After her escape at age 17, she spent the next 20 years tenaciously seeking various forms of therapy to recover from this trauma. Slowly, consistently, she made her way up the ranks to becoming a national sales manager, earning a six-figure income based 100% on commission. At age 40, she purchased her dream lake house in Maine. After finding her own freedom from suffering, Catherine realized that the sexual abuse and sex trafficking that had claimed her life 35 years ago was unbelievably still going on, destroying the lives of thousands of children in Maine today. She founded Stop Trafficking ME, now known as Stop Trafficking US, with the goal of stopping grown-ups from sexually exploiting children. Via public and private speaking engagements, social media, TV, radio and print, Stop Trafficking US works to educate the community on the life cycle of abuse, and the horrific domino effect that occurs after a child has been sexually abused in any way.

District Attorney Jonathan Sahrbeck was born and raised in Cumberland County. He began his legal career as a prosecutor in Massachusetts, working over five years as an Assistant District Attorney in numerous locations. DA Sahrbeck returned to Maine in 2012. He then worked as a Human Trafficking prosecutor in Cumberland County starting in 2016. DA Sahrbeck was elected Cumberland County District Attorney in 2018 emphasizing a focus on public safety, law enforcement, and standing up for victims.
