Speaker: Robert Stevens Esteemed educator and historian of the lifetime achievements and works of Winston Spencer Churchill

Robert Stevens, as the former principal of York High School for over 37 years, and the longest serving secondary school principal in the entire country, is a local legend. However, his love affair with Churchill began over 43 years ago when he began sharing history books with two YHS educators who served in WWII. Bob began by reading Churchill's four volume work of WWI and since then has read all his major works, plus more than 50 biographies, including the official one (over 17 volumes). In 1990, Bob was privileged to represent the Harvard Principals Center at Oxford University, where he was treated to many private tours of Churchill's haunts. As a member of the International Churchill Organization for over 35 years, the IWCNE is most fortunate to hear Bob share his expertise on one of the most memorable and remarkable statesman of our time, The Last Lion, Winston Spencer Churchill.


Speakers: Laura Dehler and Patricia Martine
