She worked as a bi-lingual secretary at the United Nations both in Geneva and New York for about 10 years. From 1984 to 1990, she was administrative assistant to Javier Perez de Cuellar, the Secretary-General of the United Nations. She often accompanied the Secretary-General as part of his delegation on visits to member states. She "retired" from the UN in 1990 to raise a family, spending 5 years in Germany with her husband before moving to Durham, NH, in 1998.

She is a grant writer and Outreach/Ally building Coordinator for Gedakina (www.gedakina.org), Pronounced 'G dah keen nah' and means "Our World, a Way of Life" in the Abenaki/Algonquin language. Programs focus on women's and youth leadership opportunities, outdoor recreation, prevention/healing of sexual and domestic violence, early reader literacy, family engagement, environmental stewardship, and food systems recovery.
