Surviving the Devastation of My City, Coventry, in World War 11

Gwyneth was born in Coventry, England and survived the devastation of her City during World War 11. She became a Legal Shorthand Writer for the Attorneys for the City of Coventry. One memorable assignment there was having the opportunity to work closely with Winston Churchill`s recently retired private secretary at the Assizes for a period of time.

In 1951 she and her husband went to Canada, remaining there for 18 years during which time she raised two children while working on real estate transactions for Ontario Real Estate Agencies. and as a Fashion Show commentator and professional fashion model both on television, stage and newspapers.

Through Gwyneth's husband being a member of the Professional Engineers Association in Canada, Gwyneth became President of the Engineers' Wives Association, helping to raise funds to help foreign students with their funding. She was also a guest speaker at Toastmaster International events in Ontario.

Moving to Chicago in 1969, continuing her activities, she became an American Citizen in 1975. In 1986 she moved to Maine, where her activities continued in the fashion area working charitable shows for Southern Maine Medical Hospital, Dress for Success, Womens` Heart Health and Hospital fund raisers. She became a member of IWCNE at its inception and has enjoyed the fellowship and understanding of its membership of 17 countries and also the ability to help them raise funds for women and children`s charities.
